1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives

4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-

5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all

6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when

7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

"ARTICLE—

2 "SECTION 1. Every citizen of the United States, who
3 is of legal voting age, shall have the fundamental right
4 to vote in any public election held in the jurisdiction in
5 which the citizen resides.

6 "SECTION 2. The fundamental right of citizens of the 7 United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by 8 the United States or by any State or political subdivision 9 within a State unless such denial or abridgment is in fur-10 therance of a compelling governmental interest and is the 11 least restrictive means of furthering that compelling gov-12 ernmental interest.

13 "SECTION 3. The portion of section 2 of the four14 teenth article of amendment to the Constitution of the
15 United States that consists of the phrase 'or other crime,'
16 is repealed.

17 "SECTION 4. The Congress shall have the power to18 enforce this article and protect against any denial or19 abridgement of the fundamental right to vote by legisla-20 tion.".
